

## Sport Premium Report

From September 2013, all schools have been provided with funding to support the Olympic legacy and to enable the delivery of effective sports provision. Within the Diocese of Salisbury Academy Trust we aim to provide high quality sport. At Whitesheet CE Primary School Academy, over a number of years we have provided the following:

- **Opportunities for children to participate in a variety of sports and competitions**
- **Access to high quality coaching in a variety of sports from specialist sports coaches**
- **Continuing professional development for teachers to enable even better teaching of PE and sports**
- **A school-wide passion for well-being linked to positive mental health through sport and fitness including 'Healthy Body, Healthy Mind' as we work towards a Healthy Schools Award.**
- **Investment in sports equipment and facilities to ensure children are active during the school day outside of PE sessions**

## Impact Report 2024/2025

Our Sport Premium Funding for the last academic year was: £16, 290. This money was used as follows and impacted as detailed below:

Upgrade sports equipment for children's independent use during break and lunch times	£370	Children have the resources to be active during break and lunch time. The equipment they have is appropriate to their physically development and safe to use independently. PE equipment purchased for pupils to rehearse skills with school staff outside of PE provision.
Sports Coach to continue to work alongside class teacher & TA 2 x afternoons per week to develop quality of teaching and specialist skills. Plus a funded lunchtime club.	£6800	Staff are being upskilled to support the provision of physical education. Children are being taught by a specialist building on a progression of skills that are appropriate to their age and stage of learning. Pupils get a broad coverage of sports activities and opportunity to compete competitively using the skills they have learnt.

Pupil and staff PE t-shirts	£285	A PE uniform has been inclusive for all pupils. House colours have created a greater sense of community with a regular kit for in house events. Pupils are safely dressed to participate and look smart.
Increased Forest School provision	£1150	Set up of weekly Forest School provision for whole school. This has supported the bonding of mixed aged classes and pupils' physical regulation. Pupils are more settled in class with this more frequent experience. Investment in additional resources has enabled whole class participation and CPL has enabled both teachers to lead learning outside the classroom.
Forest School Staffing	£5320	Preparation time, CPL time (attending and delivering), weekly sessions with all pupils. Greater connection to nature, being physical outside, team building and supportive of mental health.

## Action Plan for Current Year 2025/2026

Our Sport Premium Funding for the current academic year is: £15, 024.16. The following plan details how we plan to use the money to maintain and improve provision.

Activity	Budget	Anticipated Impact
Sports Coaching	£7000	Children will continue to develop the P.E skills gained from previous years and will have access to a range of sporting opportunities taught by qualified sports coaches. Staff will gain valuable CPD and will receive of lesson plans, which include progression of skills.
Swimming Provision	£2750	Children will develop their swimming skills and water safety awareness. This will provide vital opportunities to children who otherwise would not have an opportunity to learn this life skill. Expertise from external coaches for water safety sessions to be included this year.
Non-school time pool opening	£600	For families to swim when school is not open to practice and develop skills in a safe and familiar space.
Hosting, transport to other venues and Staffing for Sports Competitions	£500	Increasing the number of opportunities for children to participate in sports competitions. This will especially benefit children whose parents are unable to provide transport or to accompany their child to events.
Residential trips	£750	To enable all Y5/6 pupils to attend residential experience and wide range of high-risk level activities. Cost goes towards transport to all and additional support for disadvantaged pupils.
Equipment and resources	£1000	PE and sport provision will be resourced with high quality and appropriate equipment and materials. Children will have a rich, engaging P.E curriculum linked to National Curriculum objectives.
Equipment, training and resources for a Forest school area within the school grounds	£1200	To ensure a Forest School programme can run effectively and efficiently an area needs to be set up and resources within the school grounds. Training for an additional staff member to ensure succession planning and quality of activities to develop physical, and spiritual health.
Funded extra- curricular clubs and experiences	£1000	Funding to support vulnerable pupils to enable them to attend extra-curricular sports clubs before and after school. Supporting the learning of new skills, attendance, positive relationships and physical health. One off experiences to develop interests and cultural capital e.g. Paralympian visit and Circus skills workshop.
Achievement of Healthy Schools Award	£500	Funding to support the pupils to work towards a Healthy Schools Award. Developing understanding of healthy eating, food sourcing and impact of regular and rigorous exercise.
PE tops for all children and School logo polo shirts for all staff	£300	To help children develop a sense of community, team spirit and pride within their house teams. All children will be dressed appropriately for sporting activities.
